1. Crime Report- given by Officers Hairston, Lim & Morrell

3. Neighborhood Updates

a. Meeting @ Queens University

 Marty Doss and Ken Davis met with the staff of the Queens University Sports Complex in April to begin developing a relationship with the complex and the neighborhood. Queens was

Construction on the field house and the soccer pitch behind the field house are almost completed.

b. Update on All-Stops in the neighborhood

i. The list of proposed all-stops has been on the website for a month now, and there has been little to no discussion or emails as a result. The posting will remain open until the end of May to give residents the opportunity to comment pro or con for 'all stop' intersections on the proposed streets. If no further discussion exists, the Madison Park and Montclaire Neighborhood Associations will officially approach the City of Charlotte to conduct traffic studies, if necessary, and notify residents of the proposed changes. Due to the number of streets and intersections affected, we will likely hold a special meeting for residents to voice any concerns or show support. If anyone has specific objections to all stops at the following streets, or wants intersections (only in Madison Park) added to the list, please contact Ken Davis via the madisonparkhoa@hotmail.com email address, stating your name, address, and the reasons for your objection or addition request.

On this same topic, Marty was able to finally work through the issue with the traffic calming funds held in escrow by the City of Charlotte, that was given by the developer of the Magnolia apartment complex on Park Road when it was being built . We have \$13,000 remaining in that account – those funds can only be used for traffic calming measures. Marty Doss and Jane Chidry, who is running for City Council, District 6, will be meeting with the City of Charlotte on Thursday to review the school zone for Smith Language Academy, and try and determine why that part of Tyvola Road is handled differently from other school zones in the City that have stoplights and crosswalks.

c. Reminder – Lunch in the Park with Madison Park

i. Just a reminder that our annual Spring event, Lunch in the Park with Madison Park, will take place this Saturday, May 16th at Park Road Park, in Shelter #1, from noon until 2pm.
