## 7:09pm: Community Crime and Safety Report from Officer Blackwell

- Between Jan 14th and March 11th, several break-ins were reported
- No major criminal activity reported in the neighborhood during this period

## 7:12pm: President's report

- Several members of the Madison Park HOA Board attended a meeting on February 27<sup>th</sup> to receive a placemaking grant for the neighborhood
- This represents one of 10 projects, and will be used in Madison Park for a painted intersection at Wedgewood and Seneca
- Process was described and it was announced that design ideas would be solicited
- The structure at 5626 Murrayhill was demolished and the lot cleared

#### 7:16pm: Guest Speaker: Carol Thompson, Master Gardener

- Description of Master Gardener program, a volunteer based program provided by Mecklenburg County and in partnership with NC State and NC A&T
- A description of proper pruning, planting, and lawn care techniques was presented
- Safety concerns and information about watering were discussed
- Soil testing packets and a variety of informational materials were distributed

7:33pm: Guest Speakers: Mike Osbourne, Tesho Okioga Tega, Kyle Massey, and Richelle Hines, regarding the wastewater Replacement Project slated to take place in Madison Park and adjacent neighborhoods

- The neighborhoods sewer system dates back to when the area was developed in the 1950's, and it subsequently reaching the end of its ability to function properly
- Despite periodic improvements, the system has deficiencies such as failing pipes and stormwater overflows
- Modern methods and materials for handling wastewater have improved significantly
- Phase I of this project includes identifying the location of deficiencies and conducting hydraulic modeling to estimate the size of future pipes
- Current estimated of linear footage needed exist but the actual total amount of work that needs to occur is currently unknown
- A description of the testing, surveying, and inspection process was presented
- A discussion of the easement acquisition process was also provided
- Every attempt will be made to communicate the process and ensure that the neighborhood is made aware of what is happening
- Questions regarding the process, the timeline, and cost were taken and answered
- There will not be a cost to homeowners
